Can speak with a degree of fluency and spontaneity, making it possible to interact with native speakers. Can take an active part in discussions in familiar contexts.

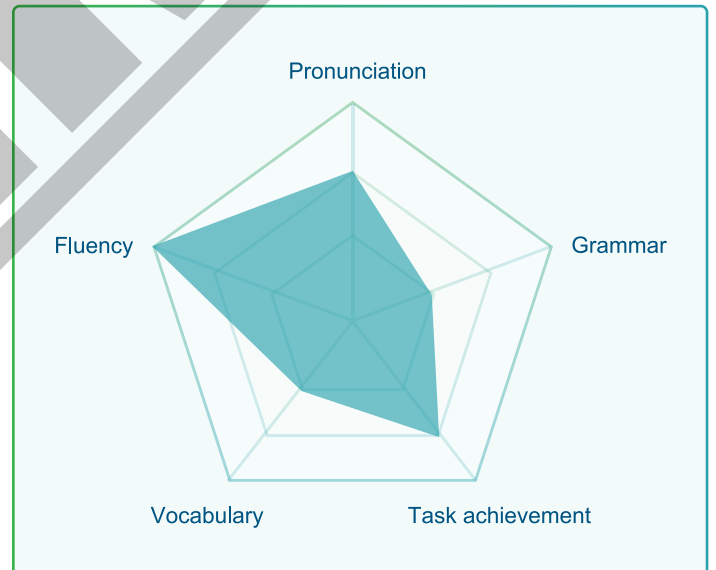
**B1 Independent user**
